



### Norman J. Ornstein

Norman Ornstein is a scholar and analyst of American politics and policy. He writes a column for *The Atlantic and National Journal* called “Washington Inside Out” and is an election eve analyst for BBC news.

He served as co-director of the AEI-Brookings Election Reform Project and participates in AEI’s Election Watch series. He also serves as a senior counselor to the Continuity of Government Commission. Mr. Ornstein led a working group of scholars and practitioners that helped shape the law, known as McCain-Feingold, that reformed the campaign financing system. He was elected as a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 2004. He is Chairman of the Board of the Campaign Legal Center.

His many books include *Intensive Care: How Congress Shapes Health Policy* (AEI Press, 2006); *The Broken Branch: How Congress is Failing America and How to Get It Back on Track*, with Thomas E. Mann (Oxford University Press, 2006 named by the Washington Post one of the best books of 2006 and called by the Economist “a classic”); and most recently, the New York Times bestseller, *It’s Even Worse Than It Looks: How the American Constitutional System Collided With the New Politics of Extremism*, also with Thomas Mann, published in May by Basic Books, named Book of the Year by Ezra Klein’s Wonkblog, one of the ten best books on politics in 2012 by The New Yorker, and one of the best books of 2012 by the Washington Post and updated in 2016. Ornstein was spotlighted as one of 2012’s 100 Top Global Thinkers by Foreign Policy Magazine.
